CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE STATISTICS



Approximately 1 in 5 children will experience child sexual assault or exploitation.

(JPrice-Robertson, Bromfield and Vassallo, 2010; Mills, Kisely, Alati, Strathearn, & Najman, 2016; Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse, 2017)

In up to 90% of child sexual assault cases, the offender is known to the family.

98% of all child sexual assault reports made by children are found to be true.

A child aged 0-9 years is approximately 40 times more likely to be the victim of sexual assault than of kidnapping or abduction.

Approximately 1 in 3 cases of child sexual abuse are instigated by other young people.

Children with a learning disability are 2.5 times more likely to be the subject of a sexual abuse allegation than children without a learning disability.
